Background information

Via Francigena

The modern Via Francigena is a route of slow travel, cultural discovery, and soul searching, that traces the journey of archbishop Sigeric of Canterbury on the way back from his pilgrimage to Rome to obtain the episcopal pallium from Pope John XV.

The Via Francigena, a certified Cultural Route of the Council of Europe since 1994, crosses 5 countries - England, France, Switzerland, Italy, and the Vatican City.

In 2019 the route was extended from Rome to Santa Maria di Leuca, based on an *Itinerarium Burdigalense*, a travel of an anonymous pilgrim from 333 AD.

Today the Via Francigena counts 3.200 km, 148 stages, crosses 16 regions and 644 European municipalities.


European Association of the Via Francigena ways (EAVF)

The EAVF was founded on 7 April 2001 as a voluntary association of local authorities and public institutions, which now unites 193 local authorities and regions, and 70 associations, and more than 400 private stakeholders along the route.

The Association is a certified carrier network of the Via Francigena route, recognised by the Council of Europe in 2007 for the enhancement of the Via Francigena legacy and promotion of its heritage.

ROAD TO ROME: 4 months on the road

To mark the association's 20th anniversary (2001 - 2021), EAVF organises, together with its network of partners and friends, the "*Via Francigena - Road to Rome 2021. Start again!*" event. Departing on 16 June 2021 from Canterbury Cathedral, km 0 of the itinerary, a group of pilgrims and ramblers including the EAVF staff, local associations, journalists, videomakers, and influencers will walk and cycle along the entire route to Santa Maria di Leuca, covering every stage of the trip and carrying the symbolic pilgrims' staff – our very own "Olympic torch". Anyone interested in joining the group is more than welcome to walk/cycle with us.

Road to Rome 2021: EAVF organises 4-month long relay march along the Via Francigena to celebrate 20th anniversary

"Via Francigena - Road to Rome 2021. Start again!" is an upcoming event organised by the European Association of the Via Francigena ways (EAVF) to celebrate the 20th anniversary of their foundation. The event, a relay march from Canterbury in the UK to Santa Maria di Leuca in Apulia (Italy), will take place from 16 June to 18 October 2021.

The event celebrates both the foundation of the association, which took place on 7 April 2001 in Fidenza (Italy), as well as the 27th anniversary of the recognition of the Via Francigena as a "Cultural Route of the Council of Europe", granted in 1994.

Road to Rome 2021 will be a great moment of celebration, and will consist of a relay march on foot and by bicycle along the entire 3,200 km of the Via Francigena. The walkers will be carrying the symbolic pilgrim's stick – our very own "Olympic torch" – which they will pass on to the next group, step by step, along the entire journey.

The march, organised together with our network of partners and friends, is aimed at all those who love walking and cycling along cultural routes. Together we will depart on 16 June 2021 from Canterbury in the UK, which is km 0 of the Via Francigena. We will arrive in Rome on 10 September 2021, and in Santa Maria di Leuca on 18 October 2021.

The growing number of international ramblers from all over the world highlights a trend towards new ways of interpreting and practising cultural and sustainable tourism, i.e. the development of intercultural and interreligious dialogue between the community of ramblers and local welcoming communities.

One of the main goals of this event, in view of the current pandemic, is to relaunch sustainable cultural tourism along the Via Francigena and other European routes, as well as to support the Via Francigena candidacy to the UNESCO World Heritage List.

The initiative also intends to involve and mobilize both ministries and local authorities of the five countries crossed (United Kingdom, France, Switzerland, Italy, Vatican City), as well as regions and religious institutions. Road to Rome 2021 will allow us to check the state of the route, fix any shortcomings, propose improvements, and to promote regional sections.

In short, this journey aims to aggregate and unite the European territories, making the beauties of the Via Francigena known to the entire world.
